APPENDIX II: FINES AND FORFEITS:

No competitors may take part in any show until all fines have been paid.

NB Rule 68.1 for Yellow Warning Cards.

Fines payable to the H.A.K.

1. Competing as an owner/rider when not a competing member.
Forfeit all prize money and rosettes and 2,000/=
2. Competing with a horse/pony not registered with the Association
Forfeit all prize money and rosettes and 2,000/=
3. Late presentation of Rabies Certificate (with SOC permission) 2,000/=
Failure to present a valid Rabies Certificate when required.
Removal of horse from show ground and 2,000/=
4. Objection Deposit (forfeit if objection over ruled) 2,000/=
5. Maximum fine of the Appeal Committee. (Appendix III) 20,000/=
6. Maximum fine of the Disciplinary Committee. At their sole discretion

Fines payable to the Show or Event Organizing Committee:

1. Changing stabling arrangements without permission from the Show Office or Stabling Steward. Possible disqualification from the show and/or 2,000/=
2. Competing in a class when the horse/pony or rider ineligible.
Forfeit any grading or VL points, prize and rosette and Min. 2,000/=
3. Competing in five or more classes on one day
Forfeit any grading or VL points, prize and rosette and 5,000/=
4. Competing in a class with height limitations without a valid Measurement Certificate. 2,000/=
5. Competing without a number or with the wrong number.
Possible elimination and/or 1,000/=
6. Using areas of the show ground not identified as a practice area 2,000/=
7. Failure to exhibit in a Championship Showing Class
Forfeit of Qualifying Prize Money, Trophy and Rosette
8. Failure to withdraw from a class before the start of that class 1,000/=
9. Failure to withdraw/scratch from a whole show 2,000/=
10. Failure to return cups in good condition by the specified date
Additional repair costs if necessary and 2,000/=
11. Failure to withdraw from an Event before the time of Declarations
First offence 1,000/=

APPENDIX III: APPEALS AND OBJECTIONS

NB: No Party is entitled to legal representation at any hearing or enquiry. This appendix is a precise. For full information the substantive rules must be read.

H.A.K. T.D. OR CHIEF STEWARD (RULE 64)

- Only Acts during a Show

- Appointed by the HAK Technical Committee from the Official HAK List.

Powers: (Discipline and Rules at the Show or Event)

- 1) Verbal or Written Warning and/or minor Fine.
- 2) Disqualify horse and/or rider from one or all competition(s) at the show.
- 3) Issue a Yellow Card (Rule 68.1) and/or Fine.
- 4) Refer to the Appeal Committee

APPEAL COMMITTEE (RULE 67)

- Only called during a Show

- Appointed by the SOC but should consist of the H.A.K. T.D. or Chief Steward, the Senior Judge for each discipline and the Chairman of the Show but not anyone involved in the objection or appeal.

Powers: (Rules, objections, appeals, referral from the H.A.K. T.D. or Chief Steward, referrals to the Disciplinary Committee).

- 1) Reprimand and / or Issue a Yellow Card (Rule 68.1)
- 2) Disqualify horse and/or rider from one or all competition(s) at the show.
- 3) Fine not exceeding 20,000/=.
- 4) Refer to the Disciplinary Committee for suspensions

H.A.K. DISCIPLINARY COMMITTEE (RULE 68)

In some cases in Lieu of the necessity of convening a Disciplinary Committee, an offender may chose to accept a Yellow Warning Card (Rule 68.1)

To be called as soon as possible after the show and include The National Chairman, Vice Chairmen and such representatives of the disciplines or show as they see fit, but never the same people as were on the Appeal Committee.

Powers: (Misconduct, complaints, appeals of fines and referrals from H.A.K. T.D. or Chief Steward or the Jury of Appeal).

- 1) Reprimand / Probation / Fine (maximum at their sole discretion)
- 2) Suspension of Rider/owner/Authorised Agent etc. for up to three years.
- 3) Suspension of horse from competing for up to twelve months.
- 4) Refer to the Executive Committee for expulsion of person from H.A.K.,

RIGHTS OF APPEAL

Appeal to Appeal Committee from the decisions of the T.D. or Chief Steward.

Appeal to Disciplinary Committee from fines of the Appeal Committee

No appeal under provisions of Rule 66.10

No appeal to any decision of the Discipline Committee.

N.B. Cases taken directly to the Disciplinary Committee are likely to be those not connected to shows (e.g. Misuse of funds, neglect or abuse of horses, actions taken to disrupt the H.A.K. or bring the H.A.K. into disrepute.

APPENDIX IV: Guidelines for Assessing the Fitness and Condition of Horses

A horse is considered fit to compete if it can compete in a safe way without: the help of medication, jeopardizing its athletic career or capabilities or exacerbating any previous or current condition.

Horses of Level 1 and 2 may not compete, Of level 3 and 9 may compete at the discretion of a Judge, Jury, Veterinary Officer or Veterinary Ground Jury.

1. **POOR:** Emaciated. Backbone, ribs, tailhead and pelvic bones protruding. Bony structure of withers, shoulders and neck very noticeable. No fat can be felt anywhere.
2. **VERY THIN:** Backbone prominent. Ribs, tailhead and point of hips and buttocks protruding. Bony structure of withers, shoulders and neck fairly visible.
3. **THIN:** Backbone stands out but fat covers it to midpoint. Slight fat cover over ribs. Backbone and ribs clearly visible. Tailhead prominent but individual vertebrae not visible. Point of hips appears rounded but easily visible. Point of buttocks not distinguishable. Withers, shoulders and neck emphasised.
4. **MODERATELY THIN:** Slight ridge along back. Faint outline of ribs visible. Fat around tailhead can be felt. Point of hips visible. Withers, shoulders and neck not obviously thin.
5. **MODERATE:** Back is level. Ribs can not be seen but easily felt. Fat around tailhead feels slightly spongy. Withers appear rounded over spine. Shoulders and neck blend smoothly into the body.
6. **MODERATELY FLESHY:** May have slight crease down back. Fat over ribs feels spongy. Fat around tailhead is soft. Small fat deposits beside withers, behind the shoulders and along the sides of the neck.
7. **FLESHY:** May have crease down back. Individual ribs may be felt but noticeable filling of fat between ribs. Fat around tailhead is soft. Fat is noticeable in withers, behind the shoulders and in neck.
8. **FAT:** Definite crease down back. Individual ribs difficult to feel. Fat around tailhead is very soft. Fat deposited along withers, behind the shoulders, along inner thigh. Noticeable thickening of neck.
9. **VERY FAT:** Obvious crease down back. Fat patchy over ribs. Bulges over tailhead, withers, shoulders and neck. Fat along inner thigh may rub together. Flank filled in flush with fat.
